

CC#2- WEEBLY= Your Online Portfolio

For this week's CC, go to www.weebly.com. I would HIGHLY recommend using a laptop or desktop to do this. It is much harder to build your Weebly on your phone or iPad- trust me, it does not work well at all.

1. Make an account. Only choose the free option. You do not need to "upgrade" or pay for anything. If you already have a Weebly or a website, you can continue to use it, just make sure it is updated with the information I am requesting.
2. Pick any theme you want. Delete their sample blurbs that do not pertain to you!!!
3. Create several standard pages. Create these 5 pages and label them as such:
 - Homepage
 - Artwork
 - Blog
 - About
 - Contact
4. Design a **logo** for your homepage. Your logo should be more than just your name written in your normal handwriting. Make sure your logo is unique. Don't just draw a Vans logo or something that already exists, like a brand. Think about what you like, your passions, and your visual aesthetic/style. Make it fun, bold, clear, and have high contrast. It can include your name if you want, or not.

If you draw your logo by hand, scan your drawing, or, take a HIGH QUALITY photo of it (use your phone then e-mail it to yourself), then upload it on your homepage. Make sure the photo is CROPPED, IN FOCUS, and WELL LIT. You know what looks good/professional. Make it look as nice as you can!
5. On your "**About**" page, please write at least 3-5 sentences (or more) about yourself. Tell us what your passions or hobbies are, what you love to do, and possibly what you might want to do after your high school career? Upload at 3-5 images on this page, of either photos of you, friends, family, or simply things you love or represent you.
6. On the Contact page, please either create a "form" (one of the options) for people to message you, or list an e-mail address. If you want to share links to other social media accounts, go for it!
7. Leave all other pages blank for now.
8. This is due this Friday, September 14th. If you need help with doing your Weebly, ask me AT SCHOOL, before Friday. I am in my room typically every day before the start of school, at snack, lunch, and after school.

Taking Photos of Your Art for Weebly

For every major project, you will need to take a photo of your finished work of art & add it to your Weebly (or equivalent site).

-Photos should be added to your “Artwork” page.

-Photos should be...

- ~ Taken using your camera/phone
- ~ Be in focus and clear
- ~ Well lit
- ~ Cropped as close to the artwork as possible (You can do this in editing on your phone or computer)
- ~ Please do not have your hand, shadow, or any other objects or people in the photo
- ~ If your piece has irregular edges and the background must be seen, make sure to lay it on a visually appealing but neutral surface (our classroom floor is perfect for this)

*If there are certain detailed areas of your project you like, you may include other close-up shots of those parts.

Above or below EACH photograph of your project, you need to include a LABEL!

Your label should be typed as follows:

Title of your artwork (in quotes or italicized, make up an amusing title), size (in inches, length x height), media (all materials used), general date.

Example:



My Dog Boo, 18”x24”, pen on paper, September 2018.
